PAUL reduced all of scripture to just three words: FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE.

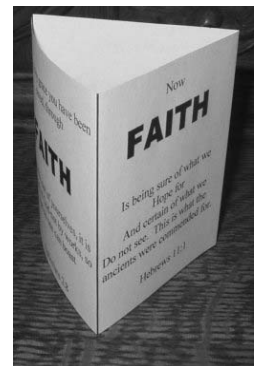
THEY ARE **VERY BIG WORDS AND WORTH FOCUSING ON OVER AND OVER.** The following craft ideas will give your children many of these words, one at a time, and a whole week to think about them.



Our favorite is making a small set of flip scriptures. Simply print out a set of mini cards on the WORD of your choice (heavy paper works best), and cut it into three vertical columns. Fold the first column on each of the lines and then fold up the bottom about 1 ½ inches and tape or paste to the back of the top card. Cut the remaining two columns on the lines so you have six single cards. Using a paper punch make two holes in each of the cards and the base. Tie with yarn...or our own personal choice elastic string.



FASTEST of all of our quick crafts is to print a sheet of cards and cut the strips horizontally. Fold on the lines. Whether you leave it open faced or tape the outside edges into a triangle you have a very attractive display for anyone's desk.. For a great Fathers day gift you can print scriptures on both sides of the flat



version and white out one verse for a personal message to Dad. They are just the right size for him to slip in his pocket.



THE SIMPLEST REFRIGERATOR MAGNET IN THE WORLD.

Any hobby store in the world will have rolls of this magnetic tape, also most hardware stores. It is self adhesive and takes about two minutes class time. For a little color let the kids hi lite the verse or the scripture reference or both.



Another idea is to thread the cards on a piece of yarn for children who do not have a desk in their room

OR help the children understand another great truth of scripture ...that scripture is meant to be shared. By folding two mini cards on the line and sending them to new people in your church, the hospitalized, or the leadership of your church.
